On this 19th day of October 1863, before me, James A. Hawley, Clerk of the County Court in and for the County and State above named, personally appeared Anneira B. Morris, a resident of Sublette, in the County of Lee and State of Illinois, aged Twenty Four years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on oath make the following declaration as guardian of the minor children of Edward McKune, deceased, in order to obtain the benefits of the provision made by the act of Congress approved July 14, 1862, granting pensions to minor children under sixteen years of age of deceased officers and soldiers: That she is the guardian of Emily C. McKune and Frances H. McKune

whose father was a Private in Company (C), commanded by Captain William Frost, in the 75th Regiment of Illinois Volunteers, in the war of 1861 and that the said Edward McKune died at Perryville on or about the 8th day of October, 1862, by reason of being shot that the mother of the aforesaid child (state the date of mother's death, or that she has remarried) remarried on the 10th day of May 1863

that the dates of birth of his said wards are as follows: Emily C. McKune, born October 1857; Frances H. McKune, born 17th Oct 1860;

She further declares that the parents of her said ward were married at Sublette on the 1st day of November, 1856, by John Pinkney; and she also declares that she has not in any manner been engaged in, or aided or abetted the rebellion in the United States.

She hereby constitutes and appoints CHARLES C. TUCKER, of Washington, D. C., her attorney to prosecute this claim for a pension and procure a certificate, and revokes and countermands all former authority that may have been given for the above specified purpose.

Eddy, a resident of Lee Center Lee Co Ill, persons whom I certify to be respectable and entitled to credit, who being duly sworn according to law, declare that the children named in the foregoing declaration are the only children under sixteen years of age of Edward McKune, who died or was killed in the service of the United States as stated in the said declaration which has been made and signed in their presence, that the mother of said children (is dead, or has remarried,) has remarried

and that they believe that the date and place of marriage of the parents of said children, and the dates of birth of said children are correctly stated in said declaration. That their knowledge of the marriage of the said parents of the dates of birth of said children and of the (death or remarriage) remarriage of the mother, is derived from intimated funeral acquaintances.

INSTRUCTIONS.

The declaration must be made before an officer of a Court of Record, who is authorized by law to administer oaths, and has custody of its seal.

A certificate of the guardian's appointment, over the seal of the Court or Judge by whom the appointment was made, must be sent with each claim.

There is also required to be sent with each claim, proof of the marriage of the parents, and of the precise date of the birth of the child or children. If such testimony is obtainable, this proof must consist of duly authenticated transcripts from county, town or church records; and if the custodian of the records is not a public officer, using an official seal, he must make affidavit to the correctness of the copy, and the official character and signature of the Magistrate before whom he is sworn, be certified to in the usual manner. If record evidence is not sent its absence must be accounted for in the declaration; the marriage can then be proven by a sworn certificate from the Clergyman or Magistrate who married them, or of others having a knowledge of the fact; and the dates of births by persons who can testify to the precise dates, the witnesses mentioning in their affidavits facts and circumstances which enable them to fix the dates. If the mother is living, her deposition to the number and ages of the children should be sent.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Edward McKune was enrolled on the 13th day of August, 1862, at Sublette Ill., in Co. E., 75th Regiment of Illinois Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 2^d day of September, 1862, at Dixon Ill., in Co. E., 75th Regiment of Illinois Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. E. of that Regiment, for the months of September and October, 1862, he is reported "Killed in battle near Perryville Ky. Oct 8th 1862."

under sixteen years of age, of Edward McClure in Company E of the 75th Regiment of Illinois Volunteers, in the civil war of 1861-5, for suppression of the Rebellion against the United States Government, and that she and her said ward have not in any way been engaged in, or aided or abetted said Rebellion. That her said ward are now in receipt of a Pension under an act of Congress, entitled "An Act to grant Pensions," approved July 14, 1862, and was paid upon Pension Certificate No. 12183 to include March 4th 1867, at the Chicago Ill Agency, and reference is hereby made to the above named Pension Certificate No. 12183 and other papers on file therewith, for any necessary evidence not herein contained.

That the said Edward McClure, father of her said ward, died at Pennville Kentucky on or about the 18th day of October 1862, by reason of wounds received in battle,






